Reformation Still Needed in 2023

On October 28 & 29 we will celebrate Reformation Sunday. Here at Our Redeemer, on Reformation Weekend, we will see lots of people wearing red, sing Luther's most famous hymn, "A Mighty Fortress" and during Growing in God (Sunday School), share in learning more about Luther and the Reformation through a variety of fun activities. As a life-long Lutheran, I look forward to this celebration each year. And yet, lately I've been asking myself a couple of questions that I'd like to share with you!

Why celebrate an event that happened 506 years ago? Why celebrate a movement that began in the 16th century when life (including the church) is so different in the 21st century?

In the mid-20th century, when I was growing up, Reformation was a time to teach us about the differences between Lutherans and our Roman Catholic neighbors. I remember experiencing it as very anti-Catholic.

By the late-20th century, I had become a pastor and it was a time of dialogue between various church bodies, including Lutherans and Roman Catholics. While we could not get to the point of full communion, our relationship with the Roman Catholic Church certainly changed for the better. (I can show you my picture shaking the hand of Pope Benedict XVI in 2006 when I visited the Vatican with ELCA leaders.) In those years, we began to emphasize the commonality of our faith in Jesus Christ.

Today, at this time in the 21st century, we are living in a climate where "Lutheran" schools, colleges, social ministry agencies and even some congregations don't want to be labelled as Lutheran with the hope of appealing to more people. At the same time, many Roman Catholics, Lutherans, and Mainline Protestants are struggling against the ideology of Christian Nationalism in this country.

So, again I ask myself and you, why celebrate Luther posting 95 Theses in Wittenberg, Germany on October 31, 1517? Why celebrate a movement whose roots are in the 16th century?

Here are a few of the answers in my mind. This annual celebration is a reminder that reform is always needed. We need reform in our own lives as well as in the institutions around us. When we think about reform today, it is most helpful to look toward ourselves rather than toward others. Remember Luther was asking for changes within the church of which he was a member.

Martin Luther and the reforming movement that he and his colleagues began emphasized that through Jesus Christ every baptized child of God has direct access to God. This means praying directly to God, confessing our sins to God and hearing the absolution. It means having access to Holy Scripture through words we can read and books we can have at hand. It means learning about the faith from our families as well as the church. This direct relationship with God through Jesus also means that we are responsible for sharing the faith with others and forming our opinions and our action based on faith rather than on the many loud voices that appeal for our loyalty in this life.

As we approach Reformation in 2023, I urge each of us to ask ourselves whether we are taking advantage of the important results of the Reformers' work. Five centuries later, do we not need a continuing reformation movement...especially within our own hearts and minds?

Since the beginning of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (in 1987), there has been a commitment to being a church body that makes a difference in the world. As a way to engage members and friends in conversation around important issues, the ELCA has created Social Statements. Pastor Martha will lead us in study of some of these statements, beginning with Church in Society: A Lutheran Perspective. Included in our conversations will be how to interpret scripture passages that seem to speak to modern issues as well as a perspective on how we can best have civil conversations in our very divided world (perhaps even among family and friends). After an Overview, the class will choose a social statement to delve into. All adults are welcome. Please join us even if you can't attend every Sunday!

(Please note: There will be no class on October 1. On October 29 we will join in the intergenerational Reformation Fest.)


Crossroads Confirmation




Luther Fest


Growing in God

Ringgold Elementary School North Blessings in a Backpack Update:

We are busy getting everything ready to start packing in October. Over 40% of the students at the school (147 kids) are eligible for the program this year and letters have been sent to those families explaining the program and their option to participate. Teachers can also make a referral for a child. Our goal again this year is to discreetly provide bags of food to kids who experience food insecurity on weekends when they do not have access to free school meals. Each bag will contain approximately 9 items for a regular weekend and 12 items for a long weekend. It costs about \$150 to feed each child for the school year. We are so thankful for the support of the church in the form of both food collections and monetary donations. Please see below for information on how you can help.
