Created for Community

The season of Lent begins early this year, with Ash Wednesday on February 14. During these forty days before Easter, our focus is on repentance and reflection as we journey with Jesus to Jerusalem and the cross. The traditional disciplines of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving/service. Aided by these practices, we often focus on what we need to give up or take on in order to draw closer to God.

While these individual practices and internal re-orienting can be very meaningful, our Ash Wednesday liturgy reminds us that we enter this season together "with the whole church." Indeed, our faith is not a solitary venture. In baptism we are joined to Christ and to the church, the Body of Christ.

The theme for our midweek Lent services this year is "Created for Community." On Wednesday evenings from February 21 through March 20, we will gather for food, fellowship, and worship as we explore the ways we are in community with creation, all the saints, our neighbor, those on the margins, and with Christ. In addition to the readings, prayers, and hymns that highlight each week's exploration of the theme, we will practice being community together through the very nature of our gatherings, as we get to know one another in conversations around the dinner table, through interactions during worship, and by working side-by-side on a collaborative art project.

Being in community together is central to who we are as people of God. On our Lenten journey, and in our life of faith, we have the gift of community for encouragement, accountability, and support. As members of the community, each of us - regardless of age or experience - has things to teach, and things to learn; things to give and things to receive.

I hope that you'll join us for these Wednesday evenings. The potluck dinner begins at 6pm in the social hall - make something, buy something, or just bring yourself! Worship for all ages begins at 7pm in the sanctuary. Your presence is a gift, and we are all enriched as individuals and as a congregation by our time spent together as we share in the joys and challenges of life in community.

While Lent is a time to pay attention to spiritual disciplines as individuals, it is also a time to deepen our sense of community. Through engagement with scripture and one another we will have the opportunity to hear God's word not only for ourselves but also for our community and the world.

This year, in the Old Testament readings, we will be reminded of five covenants that God made with the people. Palm/Passion Sunday March 23 (5:30pm) and March 24 (9:00am and 11:00am)

Come and hear the joy and the sorrow that surrounded Jesus' entry and trial in Jerusalem. Recall the events that brought on Jesus' suffering and death which bring life to us.

Maundy Thursday March 28 at 7:00pm

We recall Jesus' final evening and the institution of Holy Communion. The service also includes Stripping the Altar as we prepare for Good Friday.

Call Committee Update

In keeping with Our Redeemer's Constitution, seven members of the congregation were elected by the church council to serve as the Call Committee to call our congregation's next senior pastor. The committee began convening in November, with an initial training meeting with Pr. Peter Asplin, Assistant to the Bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod, who works with new pastoral calls. Members of the committee are: Sara Casile, Brian Casper, Laura Culp, Alison D'Addieco, Garrett Langley, Gary Milavec and Tim Prex.

The committee has been meeting regularly and is currently in the process of completing a required "Ministry Site Profile," a detailed online document which essentially serves as a "resume" of our congregation and includes extensive background information about Our Redeemer and its leadership. The time-consuming process of information gathering and writing is nearing completion, and the committee hopes to transmit a draft of the profile to the council, for their approval, in the coming weeks. Once approved, the profile is formally submitted to the synod. The synod will then formally upload the profile, and will begin to match candidates with our congregation, first sending candidate profiles to the Call Committee, who will then interview candidates and make recommendations to council.

Snow/Bad Weather Policy

When a winter weather event occurs or when the weather forecast predicts a snow event to take place during the time of scheduled worship, the Senior Pastor and Council President will make a decision regarding the cancellation of one or more worship services. While the goal is to never cancel a worship service, the safety of our staff and worshippers will be kept in mind. If a decision is made to cancel one or more worship services, the congregation will be notified via Constant Contact (the congregational email). Notice will also be posted on the website and Facebook.

Lenten Project for Abiding Missions

Abiding Missions has been serving Pittsburgh's Allentown neighborhood for the last ten years. Pastor Christine Rotella is the neighborhood pastor and a large part of the vision behind Abiding Missions. (Many people remember Pastor Christine from her diaconal internship here at Our Redeemer.) Abiding Missions has had a huge impact on the Allentown neighborhood, providing ministries that strengthen the community while supporting individuals and families. Their ministries include a Food Pantry, After School, Adult Breakfast Fellowship, and a Community Choir.

During Lent (Ash Wednesday – Palm Sunday), we will be collecting items that are much needed by the people served by Abiding Missions. Items needed are: underwear for children and adults (all sizes), deodorant sticks, feminine products, socks for children and adults. Any kind of toiletries for women and men are appreciated as well. Many of these necessary items are costly and not allowed under food stamps rules. Their food pantry is always in need of condiments (e.g. ketchup, mustard, mayo).

Donations can be dropped off in the narthex during the first five weeks of Lent. Your generosity in support of the people of the Allentown neighborhood and Abiding Missions will be greatly appreciated!

Souper Bowl Sunday of Caring

The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer said by Reverend Brad Smith at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in Columbia, South Carolina: *Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat.*

Since 1990, it is estimated that more than \$175,000,000 have been donated by the efforts of more than 305,000 unique groups. Most of the money raised is given to local organizations that work to combat hunger in their own communities.

Here at Our Redeemer, on the weekend of February 10 & 11, we will be collecting money after the worship services. All money collected will be given to Abiding Missions Food Bank in Pittsburgh's Allentown neighborhood. Thank you ahead of time for your generosity.

Blessings in a Backpack

Blessings in a Backpack at Ringgold Elementary School North continues to feed approximately 105 kids each weekend. Since the beginning of the school year, ORLC has donated approximately 1100 individual items as well as monetary donations to help feed kids over the weekend when they do not receive the free school breakfast and lunch! We are so grateful for all of the donations, and they were used immediately in the bags to provide 8 items per child each weekend and also 13 items for the holiday breaks. Our program depends entirely on donations of food and monetary donations to buy food in bulk. Your support keeps our program going and helps to fill over 100 bellies each weekend. Our greatest need right now is pasta cups, such as Chef Boyardee pastas or mac and cheese. Moving forward, new Blessings in a Backpack guidelines require that they have pop tops, require no preparation, and are ready to eat because some of the children may be home alone and may not have access to a microwave. We are still able to use applesauce/fruit cups or squeeze pouches as well. Thank you for being a blessing to our Blessings in a Backpack program! Free Tax Assistance

Free Tax Assistance will be offered by VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) at The Bible Chapel, 300 Gallery Drive, McMurray, PA 15317. Volunteers will be available Monday through Thursday starting February 5, 2024 through April 4, 2024 from 8:00am until 2:00pm. No appointments. First come, first served. No new returns started after 1:00pm.

You must bring: last year's federal and state tax returns; photo ID for yourself and spouse; social security cards and birthdates for yourself, spouse and dependents; all W-2 and 1099 tax documents (including Social Security Benefits Statements SSA-1099),1095 health care statements; proof of bank account routing and account numbers for direct deposit such as a blank check; total paid to daycare provider and daycare provider's tax identification number; property tax receipts. To file taxes electronically on a married-filing-joint tax return, both spouses must be present to sign the required forms.

Federal, state, local taxes and property tax/rent rebate forms are prepared.
