"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers." Acts 2:42

During the season of Easter, our first reading in worship comes not from the Old Testament, but rather from the book of Acts. Acts, written by the same author as the Gospel of Luke, follows the early Church as the new believers learn, grow, and share life together, gathering as a community shaped by the good news of Jesus.

I especially love this passage from Acts 2 that we heard in worship at the end of April for the way it so succinctly describes a rhythm of life that is familiar to us even today. Learning together, sharing in fellowship, eating and worshiping together - these are the joys of community! Through these actions we strengthen our bonds as siblings in Christ and co-workers in the Gospel. As we grow in relationship to one another, we find opportunities to give and receive care, support, encouragement, and joy.



REMEMBERING

Our Redeemer's preschool program, Noah's Ark, has a history of being supported by an incredible staff of teachers and board members. Each of these individuals over the years has dedicated their time and shared their talents to enhance the philosophy and mission of the preschool.

Several of us who have retired from the preschool meet frequently for lunch, coffee, Bible Study or general "catching-up." During one of our times together several of us realized how many teachers that have passed. Most recently, Shannon Mincin, who taught with Peggy Barczak, died of cancer. A few years prior we mourned the passing of both Mindy Hudson and Chris Kail. "Let's honor these individuals and others by creating a sensory/memory garden on the preschool playground." Everyone was enthused and ready to find plants that would encourage the preschoolers to enjoy gardening and hear how these people had loved our preschool.

After many discussions about location of the garden and ways to remember them, we have started growing particular plants with sensory features — lamb's ear, spearmint, thyme, sage, rosemary, lavender, a lilac bush and hens and chicks. More importantly, we have also purchased bricks with the names of our honorees that will be placed near the entrance to the preschool, on the playground.
