Let's Do This Together

Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter are upon us as you receive this month's newsletter. We increase our time in worship during this sacred time in recognition of the undying love that God poured out in the gift of Jesus Christ. Lately, I've been pondering the emotions that must have filled the disciples and other followers of Jesus as they witnessed first hand the events of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection.

Without the advantage of "hind sight" they were figuring it out together in real time! It seems that their instinct drove them to be together. In John's Gospel, Jesus found the disciples in a room behind closed doors the night of his resurrection. He greeted them there that night and there again the next week, offering peace (something they needed after all these terrible events) and sending them out with the mission to share the good news. Together...they gained strength and direction from one another, especially after Jesus was no longer physically present with them.

Never in my life could I envision a time when people would be told to go home, shut their doors and not come out for fear of catching and spreading a deadly virus. There was no class in seminary on what to do in the wake of a world-wide pandemic! But it is true, in spite of a whole host of factors, we all did what we had to do! We separated ourselves with online worship, wore masks and suspended activities. We've done our very best to get through this most difficult time. Perhaps we have a new appreciation for the first disciples who went behind closed doors for fear of what would happen next. At least in their case they went there together!

On that first Easter night, Jesus walked right through the closed door to greet his disciples. In fact, he had to do that more than once before they were all convinced. Jesus met them where they were but then he sent them out. From the very beginning right up to now, faith in Jesus is not meant to be an individual insurance policy for eternity. Jesus was all about community, care of one another and neighbor. Our faith is first of all for this world, impacting how we live our lives here and now. And our faith is best lived out together.

As we continue to work our way out of an unexpected worldwide pandemic, it is so important for us to remember that faith in Jesus is most powerfully lived when we are together, worshiping the Triune God and serving our neighbors near and far. For the Church, here at Our Redeemer and throughout the wider church, this is a time of rebuilding. We need to remember how important it is to be together and to support one another in visible ways. Our very presence is a witness to others and a lesson for our children. At Our Redeemer, we are in the process of rebuilding committees that will vision and plan for ministries inside the congregation and in service to the world. We are seeking additional volunteers for various roles in our worship services.

Is God calling you to share a bit of your time each month by getting involved in one of the committees or stepping up to help in leading our worship services or our educational ministries? The church needs you! I suspect that you need the church as well!

I look forward to seeing you in worship this Holy Week and Easter. I look forward to working side by side with you as we come out of our closed doors to serve our risen Lord with joy!

HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

PALM SUNDAY Saturday, April 1, 5:30pm; Sunday, April 2, 9 am and 11am

For Christians, Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem is a celebration even as it is a foreshadowing of the dark passion events that are about to unfold. The choir will provide musical leadership at all our services on Palm Sunday weekend.

MAUNDY THURSDAY April 6, 7pm

The word, "Maundy" means "command." On the last night of his earthly life, Jesus told his disciples, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another..." In our worship service, we will celebrate Holy Communion and participate in the Stripping of the Altar which reminds us of the humiliation faced by Jesus during his final hours on earth.

GOOD FRIDAY April 7, 10am (Children's), 12noon (Community) 8pm (Tenebrae)

On this holy day we recall Jesus' suffering on the cross. The Children's Service tells the story in a gentle, interactive way. During the service at noon, we will remember the words that Jesus spoke from the cross. The Tenebrae Service is an experience of the increasing darkness that came into the world as it crucified our Lord.

EASTER April 9, 8:30 and 11:00am (no Saturday service) Easter Breakfast 9:30-10:45

The sadness of Jesus' death is replaced by the joy of the resurrection! "He is not here; he has been raised!" We experience the joy of God's love given to us in the Risen Christ! Through song, word and sacrament, our hearts are filled with joy and gratitude!

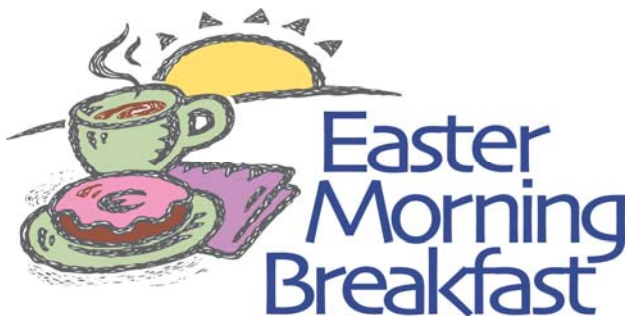
