



Dear Friends,

For me, this time of year always brings back memories of high school and college summers spent on the staff at Lutherlyn. I remember working as a KP, and then as a counselor. I remember campfires and camp songs. I remember sleeping out under the stars and in the pine forest. But most of all, I remember spending the whole summer living with other staff members in an intentional Christian community.

Twenty-four hours a day, six days a week for ten weeks we were together, and often we spent that one precious day off together, too. It wasn't a perfect community. We got on each others' nerves sometimes, and we weren't all best friends. But there was a commitment to loving each other - to seeing the best in each other and wanting the best for each other. There was a commitment to being there for each other. There was a commitment to intentionally affirming and encouraging each other, and being grateful for the gifts each staff member brought into our community.

Before and after being on staff, I've spent a week at Lutherlyn most years as a camper or a camp pastor. That's always a wonderful, renewing experience. But it doesn't come close to being on the staff. Forty-five years later, I still get a wistful tear in my eye when I think about those summers.

Jesus often spoke of the "Kingdom of God." It was his way of talking about life lived as God intends it to be, full of blessing and joy, generous forgiveness and surprising grace. Discovering a pearl of great price, uncovering a treasure, welcoming home a prodigal son... this is what Jesus says life in God's kingdom feels like. For me, it feels like a summer on the staff at Lutherlyn.

Here in the church, we have the chance to experience life as God intends it, too. Here we have the chance to live as an intentional Christian community. We may not be together six days a week, but when we are together this is a place where we can share each other's burdens and hold each other in prayer. Here we can dare to trust each other with our cares and concerns. Here we can rejoice with each other and give thanks for the way God acts in our lives. Here we can speak freely of faith and forgiveness. It's not as intense an experience as being on summer staff, but it's pretty close.

Our summer worship schedules lends itself to spending more time together in fellowship and conversation. Saturday evening worship will be outside, weather permitting. That setting seems to encourage lingering in the shade with friends old and new. On Sundays we'll have just one service at 10:00. (It will always be indoors because of livestreaming.) Having just one service gives us the chance to reconnect with people who usually come to the "other" Sunday service the rest of the year.

I encourage you to make regular worship part of your summer plans. There is no substitute for us being together in this intentional Christian community that we call "the church." Come to worship and pray. Come to love and be loved. Come to experience a bit of what life is like in the Kingdom of God.

## The Celebration of Pentecost June 4/5

On Pentecost, 50 days after the first Easter, the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the disciples and they spoke in other languages, the languages of the people from many nations who were in Jerusalem that day. Because they heard the good news of Jesus Christ in their own languages, about 3000 people believed and were baptized.

The ancient word for Spirit is also the word for breath. It's a connection that we lose in our English translation of the word. Throughout Scripture, the breath of God, the Holy Spirit, brings life and renewal and peace. The call to worship in our Pentecost worship begins, "Breathe on us, Holy Spirit..." And our children's sermons on Pentecost have often included breathing on each other to feel the power of our breath - and God's breath.

But in these lingering Covid days, breathing of each other is the last thing we want to do. So how can we celebrate Pentecost, and feel the Spirit moving among us, without a lot of breathing? Come and see. We have a way to safely feel and see the power of the breath of God moving among us.

**And be sure to wear RED- the color of Pentecost.**

Dear Synod,

As we mourn the senseless loss of family in the Buffalo and Uvalde shootings, my own grief and revulsion in the face of relentless hurt leaves me looking for more powerful ways to communicate than the words of a letter. In that spirit I offer this lament:

Are no tears left for me?  
My grief too late to register  
in the trampling train of tragedy?  
One hundred ninety-ninth in twelve dozen days?<sup>1</sup>

Is sympathy fully spent?  
My loss just “next in line”  
for hollow hurting hearers?  
One hundred ninety-ninth in twelve dozen days.

Calamities outpace days;  
care is crushed to callous coping.  
“What can anyone do?”  
One hundred ninety-nine in twelve dozen days,  
... and counting.

God, save us by your grace,  
for all our efforts fail.  
Be Thou the “God who grieves”  
each sparrow’s faint and fall,  
each child’s harrowing “Help!”  
each grandma’s journey’s end.
