Grace and Peace

The season of Lent is a time for reflection; to reflect upon our personal brokenness and consider amendment of our lives. A familiar question often asked; "What will you give up for Lent?" Standard answers include giving up chocolate, putting aside adult beverages or quitting smoking. Thirty-three years ago, I indeed gave up smoking as part of my Lenten discipline. On the upside I no longer smoke. Sadly, I did not think through the fullness of my Lenten discipline and replaced cigarettes with spare calories... lots and lots of spare calories! However, the Discipline of Lent is more than what we give up, it is also about what we take up in this season. Traditionally Lenten Discipline includes prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Too often there is a mistaken perception that all that we do in Lent will make us right with God. Rather this season is about recognizing our need for the Grace of God revealed in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.

Pastor Kerri, Pastor Martha and I have prayerfully considered some things that might help us all along the way. In this post-pandemic world, we now recognize that isolation has become a real issue for many people, so we invite you to come to Wednesday evenings at Our Redeemer beginning at 6:00pm with a potluck meal. (If you don't have time to cook grab some prepared item from a store including pizza or a bakery treat.) More importantly come, because the miracle of an Our Redeemer Potluck meal is that there is always a bounty. The importance of sharing in a meal is to help build lifegiving community for others and perhaps for you as well.

Following the meal, we will also have a worship service that begins at 7:00pm focusing on the elements of the Lord's Prayer. To help us in this worshipful reflection we will examine Martin Luther's teaching from the Small Catechism. A special part of this service will also include the opportunity to learn how to also pray this prayer using American Sign Language (ASL).

You are invited to make weekend worship a priority. During the Sundays in Lent we will focus on how questions of life and faith play an important part in our personal journeys in relationship to God and community. Holy Scripture is filled with questions raised by God and the people of God. Questions are a healthy part of a dynamic relationship with God and in worship we explore what such questions can mean for our personal journey. The invitation to reflect on matters of faith provides us all with pathways for growth that can broaden our vision of who we are as individuals and a community.

I hope you will be able to join us in this season of Lent. Let us journey together in a Lenten discipline that can fill our lives with wonder, joy as we journey to Holy Days culminating in the Good News of Easter.


