


SHARING OF HOLY COMMUNION

As Lutherans, we believe that Christ is really present in the bread and wine we share. All are welcome to commune here. Infants and others who do not commune are invited to come forward and receive a blessing.

Please take a communion glass from the ushers on your way forward. As the pastors and lay assistants give the bread and wine, they say these words to each communicant: The body of Christ, given for you; the blood of Christ, shed for you. The communicant may say: Amen. Wine is offered by Communion Assistants holding the silver chalices. Grape juice is offered by the third Communion Assistant on either side holding the pottery chalice. (The grape juice is purple.)

Gluten-free wafers are available from the pastors. Let them know that you need one when you come forward to receive the bread.

Possible Refugee Resettlement

Some of the pastors in Conference 6 (includes the South Hills, Airport area, and Washington County) of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod have been looking into the possibility of Participating in the resettlement of a refugee/family in our area. This might happen through Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services or Jewish Family and Community Services which has an office at St. John's Lutheran Church in Carnegie. In either case, we need to do some planning before we would be able to answer the who, when and where questions! Important matters like housing transportation, and job opportunities need to be looked into. A financial commitment of somewhere between \$12,000 and \$20,000 in the first six months of the resettlement is required.

At this point we are trying to identify people who are interested in helping with this process either by getting personally involved and/or by making a financial commitment This is a big project which is best undertaken by multiple congregations.
